Fresh water should be available at all times and hutches and runs should be regularly cleaned and disinfected.

Unlike many other hay products, Deans Farm. hay is neither chopped or processed allowing it to retain as much of its natural goodness and fibre as possible.

Hay should provide the majority of your Guinea Pig or Rabbit's diet and be freely available at all times.

As a general rule, their diet should consist of around:

- 80% hay
- 15% fresh vegetables (limit fruit to more of a "treat")
- 5% good quality pellets
